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Preprimary

Field Trip: Super market:

It was a fun based learning experience for our little Despite which will be cherished by them forever with a smile




LEARNING ACTIVITIES :

Name of the activity:- Stick/finger puppet




Activity:- Narrate a story using stick/finger puppet


Telugu:

Mathematics:


Topic: Factors




Science:

ACTIVITY- Model making-water cycle

Students of Grade 6 have learnt about water cycle process in the chapter The realms of the Earth. They learnt that water cycle is very important process and it shows the continuous movement of water within the Earth and atmosphere. It is a complex system that includes many different processes. Liquid water evaporates into water vapour, condenses to form clouds, and precipitates back to earth in

the form of rain and snow. The four main stages of the water cycle are evaporation, condensation, precipitation and runoff. Sun: The water cycle is driven by the energy from the sun warming the earth.

In the making of a Miniature Water Cycle Model activity, students made a model of the water cycle with different materials available at home and use to make them understand and experiment the process themselves and to explore how water moves in and out of the atmosphere in a cycle of precipitation, evaporation, and condensation. They also understood the importance of water cycle as it is an extremely important process because it enables the availability of water for all living organisms and regulates weather patterns on our planet. If water didn't naturally recycle itself, we would run out of clean water, which is very essential and is of great significance to life.

1st short film- khisa

3rd short film – street student

4th short film- karfew
